<b>Abstract:</b>	
<p>The focus of this presentation is on Information Security's (Security Administration/Logical Access) new found/changing role in organizations, of not just protecting electronic assets (keeping the bad people out), but supporting the origination's regulatory compliance obligations. This new role may also be supporting the management team with "how we manage the organization's electronic work environment"? This leads to some key issues, which involve organizational governance as it relates to; business process management, IT management, organization's compliance and Internal Audit's role. These issues will be discussed and analyzed, with some suggestions that organizations may wish to consider.</p>
