Fostering security awareness can be very challenging due to human nature. This presentation will highlight the results from a recent study, conducted among ten Fortune 500 companies in Minneapolis, MN. Participants were asked to identify 7 Highly Effective Habits of a Security Awareness Program. This is your opportunity to leverage what they learned.

Participants do not need an overly technical background to engage with this presentation. As a preliminary finding of the study is that non-security professionals frequently manage security awareness programs. As such, limited prerequisite knowledge is expected.
