SOC2+: A Cost Effective Approach to Building Customer Trust

Session Abstract

The case for SOC2+ - Vendor sourcing agreements are becoming increasingly complex and exposing companies to emerging risks. Company management, and in some cases regulators, are shifting their focus to look at the effectiveness of third party governance programs in place to address these emerging risks. All this is happening while vendors are more often contractually obligated to provide independent assurance over their processes and controls to address their customer's risks. SOC2+ is a new vendor attestation report built upon AICPA SOC2 principles which allows for an independent, standardized assessment to be performed over vendor operations and eliminates the need for costly vendor questionnaires.
